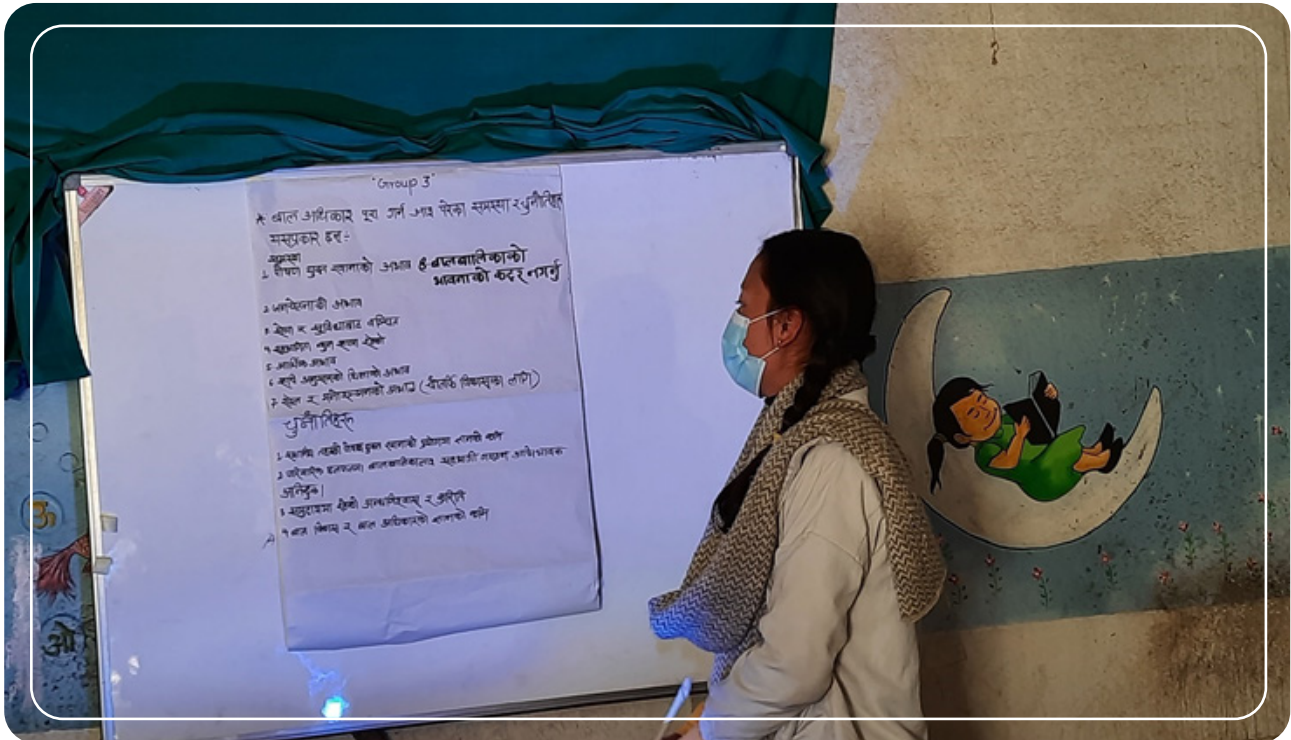

SOLVE-Nepal with child rights in Lalitpur districts

### Our Commitments:

Society of Local Volunteers' Effort (SOLVE)-Nepal, since its establishment in 1989, is involved heavily in women's empowerment and their economic empowerment in Dhankuta and other districts of Nepal. Most of the activities are carried to empower women through various economic and social development activities. SOLVE-Nepal has developed competency in economic empowerment of rural households through women entrepreneurship development and linking them with access to finance.

### Our actions:

SOLVE-Nepal is heavily involved in women empowerment activities through its different plans and projects. The concept of SOLVE, this component is one of the major areas to intervene different

interlinkages concerning women empowerment. The Economic Empowerment for Social Justice (EESJ) funded by FCA has been completed with success in 2022 covering 5000 women in different 12 women cooperatives. SOLVE is now trying to link with other agencies to make it's intervention continue.

### Recently FCA celebrated its' 10 years of establishment of development intervention in Nepal.

### A case study on Kabita;

Kabita Nagarkoti, a resident of Dalchowki-3, Lalitpur has been a member of Makhmali Women's Agriculture Cooperative. She is the board member of the same cooperative at present. She has always been an active member of the cooperative. She actively took part in various capacity building trainings, women's rights classes, gender based violence classes and got aware about the women issues. Kabita utilized all the trainings related to women issues and capacity building that she received and transformed herself into an women activist. Today it is a matter of pride for Makhmali Women's Agriculture Cooperative as well as SOLVE-Nepal that Kabita is an Executive Member of Konjyosom Rural Municipality. She is undoubtedly as example of dedication and confidence and an inspiration to many women. "Every woman is a leader, we just need an opportunity and a platform to enhance the quality of our leadership" says Kabita proudly.

# THREE

Three Sustainable Natural Resource Management and Climate change

### Our Commitments:

SOLVE-Nepal since last many years working in natural resource management and the areas of climate change. The climate change and adaptation are one of the vital issues in current period. There is an urgent need of activities based on resilient the effects of climate change. SOLVE-Nepal partnered with Livelihood Forestry Project (LFP- 2002-2012), Rupantaran ( 2013-14), Multi Sector Forestry Project (MSFP- 2014-2016), BMZ/ BASUG Germany ( 2018-2019), GIZ ( Reep- 2021-2022) and collected the best experience in this sector. Recently SOLVE-Nepal is awarded from IKI Germany to implemented climate smart agriculture practice in Nepal through a process of competition.

### Our Actions:

The project “Building Resilience of Indigenous People Through Climate Smart Agriculture Practices”

is based on the technology of doing Agriculture farming as a resilient action to protect women farmers from climate change. The project will introduce new technology of Hydroponic system in harvesting high value vegetables and supply in the market.



## Information about the project:

The project “**Building Resilience of Indigenous People Through Climate Smart Agriculture Practices**” is funded by the International Climate Initiatives IKI, Germany under the small grant facility in Nepal. SOLVE- Nepal participated in a bidding process to win the project. The project funding size is € 124941.66, which is equivalent to Nepalese currency 17,500,000.00. The project is under implementation in the Konjyosom Rural Municipality ward. No.5 of Lalitpur district. The project is based on the climate smart agriculture as a part of resilient from the climate change effects. Due to the heavy rainfall of Ashwin 11 and 12, 2081, the project was also affected due to the heavy flood in the area, where the prepared land was also swept out. So, the project is getting some slow to implement.

## The process:

SOLVE-Nepal has established 12 women cooperative in the south Lalitpur among them one of the women cooperative named ‘Gupteshwari Multipurpose Women Cooperative’ was strengthened by SOLVE-Nepal since 2066 BS (2009 AD). There are above than 550 share members saving in the cooperative and also taking loans from the cooperative. The Cooperative has selected 12 active women with business mind to work and run the hydroponic agriculture system so that after the construction of system, they will be ready to run. During the 2 year project period SOLVE-Nepal will

transfer the technology in 12 women and market management of the product.

SOLVE- Nepal is organizing an observation tour to the women group to provide a basic knowledge on the hydroponic production technology as a part of resilient from climate change effect. The project will support to women group to interact with the buyers of the product including the hotel

managers. The product of system is value added in the traditional agriculture system. So, in the initial phase, there may be some hurdles on the way to success, but SOLVE-Nepal is managing to mitigate the problems may comes during and after the project implementation. SOLVE-Nepal also completed an introductory session in the office of Konjyosom Rural Municipality. There was the participation of the Municipality Chair, vice chair and members with staff of Konjyosom Rural Municipality. All the participants are waiting for the production of such plants and to make this effort a success.

This project will inspires to more than 10000 people and the members of other cooperative also to think about the new technology.

# FOUR

### Rural Water Supply, Health and Sanitation

After the phasing out of Rural Water supply and Sanitation Fund development fund funded by the World Bank and the Nepal government, there is a lack of such institution in Nepal to address such a prominent need of the community. Currently, the local government are addressing the need of water supply in their areas as a part of local government. But, this issues should be address by a different institution as an espezialized way in the direction of local government.

SOLVE-Nepal is making effort to connect with other funding agency to address this pertinent issues differently. SOLVE-Nepal has a concept determined that water supply WASH is such an area, which is associated with the daily activities of people and concerned very much with the women. SOLVE-Nepal recently completed a CEDE project in the partnership of the World Bank, which was a



research based project but has provided the information about the need of water supply and sanitation need within Dhankuta Municipality. The efect of climate change also creating a problem of drying the water source, less rainfall or maximum rainfall creating the problem of drinking water in the rural areas, where people have to depend on the well and stream. SOLVE-Nepal is in the process to develop concepts and will propose with the probable donors for Nepal.

SOLVE-Nepal got an opportunity to work in a new technology as a pilot project in Dhankuta Municipality. The project Citizen Engagement for Digital Eco-system (CEDE) as a part of fiscal federalism in 2022 and 2023 selected ward no. 7 and 1 of Dhankuta Municipality. After the success of the pilot project in the request of Dhankuta Municipality in support of the World Bank SOLVE-Nepal facilitated the CEDE activities in all 10 wards.

The major activities taken during the project implementation was a detail discussion about the identification of public assets of the wards, which is a major asset of the Dhankuta Municipality. The two-day participatory planning workshop (PPW) involving all the representative of Tole Bikas Sanstha (TBS) was very interactive. In the recommendation of ward SOLVE selected 32 mappers representing all 10 wards as per size and population of the ward.

The involvement of women was very important in every steps of the data collection. The focus group discussion and the information was collected from the aged people also, so that they knows the history of such public assets. The great thing was to recognize every aspects of political, historical, religious belief including the current development trends facilities provided by the government. The Data Users Workshop (DUW) with the representative of wards, TBS and ward members finalized the outcomes of the data collected about the public assets. SOLVE-Nepal identified the public assets as follows:

1. Public Water Place: 377 which covers all the well exists in all wards, water source, tapstands and water tanks also.

5. 21, Agrovet centre, Veterinary hospitals.
6. 231 Roads including all weather road, rough roads, Agriculture roads.

### **Auditor's Responsibilities:**

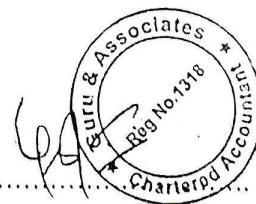
